- Increase investment in community-based BH services
- Partner with & empower trusted community partners and providers
- Increase access to timely, effective, preventive care in Milwaukee County

- Milwaukee Health Services, Inc.
- Outreach Community Health Center
- Sixteenth St. Community Health Center



Sixteenth Street Community Health Centers

- Founded in 1969
- Offer Medical, Behavioral Health, and Dental Services
- Serve 40,000 patients per year
- Employs 50 behavioral health providers



Sixteenth Street Community Health Centers-Response to BH Needs

- The needs have driven our search for more space, as SSCHC is at capacity
- SSCHC BH addressing the gaps in prevention, early intervention, and non-emergency crisis resources for individuals with BH and AODA issues
- Gaps are particularly striking for uninsured, under-insured, and Medicaid beneficiaries nearly 80% of SSCHC current patient population



Sixteenth Street Badger Mutual Site Plans

- BH and AODA
- CCS for first time to include peer support
- Some Administrative staff
- New opportunity to partner with others and collocate services



Partnership with Milwaukee County BHD

- Working on this model for well over a year
- An "intuitive partner" in meeting the need for culturally competent delivery of BH and AODA services

- Same Day, Walk in Clinic; Assessment & Response Planning
- Medication Access and Management Services
- Certified Peer Services
- Access to BHD System of Care
- Access to DHHS System of Care
- Health Ins. And Benefits Navigation
- Brief Care Coordination
- Access to other SSCHC services including primary care, medical specialty and dental services
