- **4.** Pulling Back the Layers: How Racism and Discrimination impacts Suicide Prevention Featured Speaker: Brandon J. Johnson, M.H.S We will join the Prevent Suicide Wisconsin Conference to hear this outstanding speaker.

- Brandon J. Johnson will discuss how specific population-centered issues such as systemic racism, historical trauma, and discrimination frame our work and impact communities of color. Strategies for addressing these barriers to care head-on will be discussed.
- **Brandon J. Johnson, M.H.S**. is a tireless advocate for positive mental health and suicide prevention services for youth and adults across the country. Currently, he serves as a Public Health Advisor at the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) in the Suicide Prevention Branch at the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services (HHS). Brandon's is also the Co-Lead of the National Action Alliance for Suicide Prevention's Faith Communities Task Force.
- Data from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) has shown that African American children, ages 5-12, have seen a significant increase in suicide rates over the last few years. This rate has been increasing over the last 15 years, despite the suicide rate decreasing for white children of the same age range. The suicide rate of American Indian/Alaska Native youth under 18 are continuing to see increases as well. Latinx, African-American, and AI/AN people have disproportionately been seeing challenges from COVID-19.
