Breakout Session Peer Specialist Perspective

Shirley Drake is on the staff of WCS where she serves as Program Coordinator of the Milwaukee County Behavioral Health Division Office of Consumer Affairs. She leads the team of 10 Certified Peer Specialists who work with individuals on in-patient units, the Observation unit, the Crisis Stabilization Houses, the Team Connect program, and the Froedtert ER program for individuals who overdose. She previously volunteered and worked with NAMI Greater Milwaukee. During that time, she trained as a Certified Peer Specialist, a Support Group Facilitator and Lived Experience presenter, in addition to being on staff as Program Coordinator. Shirley is a State Certified Trainer and serves on

state and local initiatives to support the further growth and value of peer support. She serves on the Psychiatric Crisis Redesign Steering Committee offering a peer perspective, and is a member of the Milwaukee Mental Health Task Force Steering Committee and Forum Planning Committee

Matt Raymond is the Supportive Housing Program Director at Community Advocates, Inc., a non-profit social service agency located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He has spent more than a decade working exclusively within the homeless services continuum in Milwaukee County where his current role has him directing multiple programs and leading a team of interdisciplinary support staff that provide immediate housing and supportive services to over 140 literally and formerly homeless individuals. His primary focus has been working with those who are experiencing severe and persistent mental illness along with chronic homelessness. He is highly experienced in using a Housing First and person-centered approach in his work and program models.

Moriah Iverson is the Business Innovations Manager at IndependenceFirst, where she identifies new strategies, programming, and resources to empower individuals with disabilities to lead independent lives using public health frameworks, theories of community engaged research, resilience-based approaches, and a focus on social determinants of health and systems change. Beth is a strong advocate for all individuals in need and a champion of personcentered care and harm reduction practices. Eric Collins-Dyke is the Assistant Administrator of Supportive Housing and Homeless Services for the Milwaukee County Housing Division. He oversees the Division's homeless outreach efforts, Housing First program, Eviction Prevention Program, and HMO Housing Navigation pilots. Collins-Dyke has been with Milwaukee County for six years and prior to that was with the Guest House of Milwaukee. His recent work has focused on local policy changes to increase the use of Housing First principles in relation to homelessness throughout Milwaukee County. Collins-Dyke leads the Milwaukee County Outreach Collaborative, which focuses on decriminalizing homelessness, street outreach coordination, housing justice, and implementing best practices within the local street outreach service provision paradigm. Collins-Dyke holds a BA in Sociology from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, and a Masters in Social Work (MSW) from Loyola University-Chicago.
