

Dwayne Mack, Wisconsin Certified Peer Specialist & Recovery Coach, Wisconsin Community Services





Assistant Chief Nicole Waldner, Milwaukee Police Department



Assistant Chief Nicole Waldner became a Milwaukee Police Officer in 1996. In 2001, Assistant Chief Waldner was promoted to Detective and was assigned to the Narcotics Division where she investigated multiple drug investigations. In 2009, Assistant Chief Waldner was promoted to Lieutenant and worked in Homicide Division, the Internal Affairs Division, and the Police Academy. She was promoted to the rank of Captain in August 2015 and was the commander of the Milwaukee Police Academy.

Assistant Chief Waldner oversees various trainings for more than 1,800 sworn police personnel, along with the department's civilian personnel. Assistant Chief Waldner was also responsible for training approximately 200 recruit officers yearly. In May 2020, she was assigned to the HIDTA. In August 2020, Assistant Chief Waldner was promoted to Inspector and was assigned to the Administration Bureau. In December 2021, she was promoted to Assistant Chief of the Administration Bureau.
