Partisan Primary: August 9, 2022General Election: November 8, 2022

Partisan Primary: August 9

 A partisan primary means you can only vote in one party. You must choose a political party and you can only vote for candidates in that party. You do not need to be a member of that party.

Important Dates:

- Deadline to register online or by mail: July 20
- Deadline to register in person at your clerk's office: August 5
- Register at your polling place: August 9
- Absentee ballots: request and return as soon as possible

What's on the Ballot

- Federal offices: U.S. Senate and Representative to Congress.
- State offices: Governor and Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, State Treasurer, Secretary of State, State Senator (odd-numbered districts), State Representative.
- Milwaukee County: Offices of Sheriff, Clerk of Circuit Court and Coroner

How to Support Voting Rights

The right to vote is an important civil rights issue and a client right issue. Here's how you can help support voting rights:	
	Share voting information and resources with your members/ clients and with other community members. "Make Your Plan to Vote", our 2022 Election Postcards and "Know Your Rights" are great or check out this list: Wisconsin Disability Vote Coalition Products
	Provide voter registration information on your website and social media. Include a link to MyVote Wisconsin and to the Disability Vote Coalition .
	Suggest that your agency include a question about voting as part of your intake process. Ask if the client wants help with voter registration or to request an absentee ballot. You can refer them to the Disability Rights Wisconsin Voter Hotline or ask us to give them a call. 844-347-8683.
	Include voting resources at your events and display at your agency. Free from the Disability Vote Coalition (DVC). Email info@disabilityvote.org
	Partner with DVC to hold a virtual training or voter registration event. Email us at info@disabilityvote.org with your request.
	Join the Disability Vote Coalition. If you work for an agency, select someone to be your voting lead, and key contact with the Coalition. Note: To be notified of Coalition meetings, send your request info@disabilityvote.org and we will add you to the list.
