The EOTO Culturally Rooted project is a community recovery and wellness organization led by Wisconsin Certified Peer Specialists.

- Envision a community of peers who share lived experiences of challenge and triumph to empower and uplift Black individuals, families, and communities across Wisconsin.

- Created through a collaboration between Chrysalis and EOTO, LLC.
- Shared vision of peer support expansion and advocacy in Wisconsin
- Community learning model
- Facilitated three learning communities and trainings
- Serving behavioral health, social services, and counties and tribes



Our Work

- Experienced team of 4 Certified Peer Specialists and allies
- Committed to supporting the integration and expansion of peer support in Wisconsin communities
- Aim to foster cultures of recovery and educate new and emerging organizations
- Focus areas: Best practices, technical assistance, consultation, supervision, and human resources.



Cohort Structure

- 6-month learning cohort with monthly learning communities (April to September)
- Cohort groups: Peer Specialists, Peer Specialist Supervisors, and Agency Leadership
- Topics: The Role of a Peer Specialist, Self-Disclosure & Boundaries, Organizational Structure, Crisis Peer Support, and more.
